This past month, JUCE TV hosted an open house for youth pastors and parachurch youth ministries. Churches

within a two hour radius of TBN headquarters in Tustin were specifically invited, but some pastors came as far as Fresno, California to attend. One of the purposes for the evening was to invite and encourage youth groups to be a part of our *JUCE Live* studio audience every Friday evening. We were encouraged when over forty different youth pastors or ministries like Intervarsity signed up to be on our email list for audience invites. In addition to speaking about *JUCE Live*, we also reached out with other ways we hope churches and young people will engage with JUCE TV. A handful of our hosts shared their hearts as to why they are a part of this network. It was encouraging to see both the diversity and depth of many of our hosts who share a love for Jesus and believe in the ministry of TBN and JUCE TV. We also appreciated Pastor D and Tramaine from the prayer ministry assisting in hosting our guests.



November 11th was Veterans Day, and JUCE TV participated in a special event to honor a select group of about 200 veterans in the Southern California region, many of whom have suffered injuries or PTSD as a result of their recent service abroad. The event was spearheaded by longtime friends to JUCE TV, Extreme Life Ministries, and it featured a number of pro freestyle motocross (FMX) riders including Ronnie Faisst, Nate Adams, Jimmy Fitzpatrick, Taka Higashino, Destin Cantrell, and Derek Garland. Many of these riders charge upwards of \$25,000 to participate in events like this, but they donated their time to say thank you to those who have sacrificed to allow us the right to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness.
