## *Seattle Praise the Lord!*

With Mount Rainier covered by clouds on the left and Puget Sound sneaking into Seattle on the right, KTBW's studio resounded with praise as we taped our *May Seattle Praise the Lord*.

The theme of this month's program was "What Is God Doing? Empowering Women!"

Within a period of 18 months, Cheryl Haskins lost her dad, husband, pastor, and oldest son. They all died suddenly with no warning. "You really find out what it means to have a Friend who sticks closer than a brother when you go through adversity," Cheryl said. "Jesus was there to comfort me, to carry me, and to tell me I was going to be okay. He did not say everything's going to be wonderful, but He said I will be here for you. Hold My hand and I'll walk you out of it."

In 2003 the doctor told Gennell Sam that she had malignant breast cancer. She had lost her mother and two sisters to breast cancer, and was too busy with her career to include God in her life. But when the doctor said her cancer was terminal, that got her attention. "Since then He has turned my life around. I'm not supposed to be here. But here I am, on this program today!"

The doctor told Flora Nobles that she had cancer of the liver in May, 2005. It was terminal, incurable,

inoperative. God told her, "All you have to do is trust Me." Today Flora is cancer free! "To the woman who is struggling with herself, who does not like herself, you've got to recognize that God created you as a wonderful woman no matter what you've gone through, what your mistakes have been. You always have another opportunity to turn back to God."

Sharon Davis summed it up. "We on this panel, we look good and pretty. But it wasn't always pretty. I know where I came from, I know what I've gone through. We go through difficult times in life, yes, but God has brought us through. He has never given up on us."
