I allowed other things to take away the time that was needed to round up toys for the children who are cared for by some of our inner-city churches. Three of these organizations support little ones through their ministry's day care and pre-school facilities by providing them with three meals a day, freshly laundered clothing, and other life essentials. Often, these ministries run short on finances and find that at the end of the year they are unable to gift their children with a toy at Christmas.

I've included photos on the following page that were taken two years ago when we delivered over 200 toys to a church school/day care in southwest Philadelphia. They were overwhelmed at seeing all of the toys gathered in front of them knowing they could select the toy of their choice. For most of the precious babies the toy they picked out that day was the ONLY toy they received during the Christmas holiday.
