Born into a minister's home, CJ Orndorff was raised in Tucson, Arizona. Music and ministry were the way they lived their lives both independently and as a family.

“If Jesus were walking on this earth today, I seriously doubt that He would be hanging with the ‘spiritual elite.’ He would be with those that He came to set free from a life that is ravaged by sin. He would be busy restoring life to the addicts, prostitutes and criminals.”



In a concert setting, CJ brings the audience into worship, shares special music, and always brings inspiring messages encouraging believers to reconnect and strengthen their commitment and walk with the Lord.

Our mission is to offer America's inmates a second chance to make good choices by providing positive, life-affirming television programming 24 hours a day.


How does it work?


Prison Outreach of Delaware






