Production

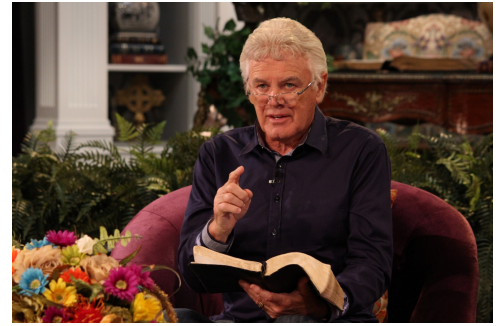
