This month, TBN Montgomery participated in the 66th annual National Day of Prayer Observance which was held at the Dexter Avenue King Memorial Church. Governor Kay Ivey gave the State of

Host Felicia Taylor interviewed Rosalyn Sales, Public Relations Director for Pilots for Christ, Inc. to discuss the organization's mission to use aviation to promote the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Rosalyn Sales' husband needed a liver transplant in 1994 and she had to drive him nearly two hours to Birmingham for the surgery. She thought: "Wouldn't it be wonderful if that time could be cut down by taking a plane or helicopter for emergency medical purposes?" That is when the ministry was conceived. Now Pilots for Christ is helping to transport people from city to city to get to their medical aid faster than by automobile. While transporting patients, Rosalyn and her husband get to pray for the patients and share the plan of salvation. She mentioned several success stories that came out of the use of the aviation program. One such story is when a child gave her heart to the Lord Jesus Christ while flying to a hospital. The child passed away but at least it was known that the child had a chance to come to know the Lord before death. Sales said that other success stories include patients who were miraculously healed. Sales said she and her husband really felt called into ministry. They were led to help people using whatever skills and talents they had while stepping out on faith into this 501 (c) 3 organization.
