Pastor Perry Stone (founder of Voice of Evangelism) hosted Dr. Tom Renfro (physician and evangelist) and Pastor Ron Stewart (evangelist), to talk about their near-death experiences and miraculous healings. Dr. Renfro shared that he was diagnosed with stage 4 mantle cell lymphoma twenty years ago and was given months to live. He immediately called his church family and others to pray. Psalm 23 kept him going as he physically was showing the sickness more and more. He told of how the tumors just “melted away” when he was given a “second line agent.” Pastor Ron Stewart shared about going in for gall bladder surgery, but when they opened him up, he had a staph infection that affected several organs. The staph infection had attached to the wires of his pacemaker, which was not a good situation. After several different doctors worked on him, Pastor Stewart had surgery on his heart and had an out-of-body experience. Hope Loftis hosted Valencia A. Breckenridge (president/CEO, GraceWorks Ministries) and Aucretia Carey (CFO, Barefoot Republic Camp & Retreat Center), who both shared great information on their ministries. Valencia shared



how GraceWorks Ministries helps people and families in need due to emergencies that arise whether it be the loss of a job, car breaking down, not enough food to eat.

GraceWorks Ministries helps pay rent, assist with care repairs, and has a hunger prevention program to help supply meals. They also have a thrift store for families in need, in case of an emergency such as a house fire, and donate air conditioning units to seniors for the summer.

GraceWorks Ministries also has a program called Stepping Forward, which helps people improve their lives by helping them reach educational goals, as well as helping them prepare for employment. Aucretia shared how Barefoot Republic Camp and Retreat center is a Christ centered camp that deals with racial reconciliation and socio-economic reconciliation. They encourage children to stay off social media and computers, by focusing on teaching them love through devotionals, worship, hiking, swimming, painting, and more not only for themselves, but others, too!
