The moving legacy of the Baddour family in founding a residential community for intellectually challenged adults was also eloquently described by Executive Director Park Pepper. Other programs included Stewpot Women's Ministries, Habitat for Humanity, and the bunk bed building ministry of Parkway Hills church.

Amy Lancaster spoke with host Pastor Jamane Williams about their family missionary organization's fearless service to homeless poor in the dangerous inner city. Her and her family moved from their comfortable home to downtown Jackson to provide shelter, structure, and a chance for a new life in Christ for those living in poverty.

SUCCESS OF NATIONAL TBN PROGRAMMING



MAJOR ISSUES IN THE MID-MISSISSIPPI AREA



A local viewer writes, "Pray for me and my family, my husband to be saved, the health of my son and daughter, and thank you for being there for me." Many Mississippians are blessed by Trinity Broadcasting Network's constant encouragement. The state ranks close to the bottom of many quality of health lists and right at the top of the national obesity spectrum. Lower cost foods, sugar-filled cereals, and quick snacks are more affordable for families on fixed or limited incomes and the result is several generations of obesity.

If God the Father is seen as a distant and frowning presence like an emotionally absent father at home, food can be a quick fix for anxiety and blue moods. Combining poor diet with a sedentary lifestyle over a lifetime produces serious health issues such as high blood pressure, stroke, diabetes, and early heart failure. The only solution may be a spiritual one. If our physical bodies are, as Paul reminds us, the "Temple of God" we truly can learn from the word of God that health and peace are found in His presence and fellowship.

TBN's excellent national programs on health along with programming that provides spiritual and emotional support

provide a way out of the cycle of unhealthy habits. Self-esteem, sound judgement, and wise choices grow out of knowing who we really are, in Christ.

Christianity was never designed to be the faith of the status quo as commitment to Jesus includes willingness to change and allow Him to heal us within. "For I know the plans I have for you", says the Lord, "Plans for good and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope!"
